



# The Turtle Creek Senior Center has been providing hundreds of senior's services and support for 52 years!

In 1972 The Turtle Creek Multipurpose Center opened as the first senior center in Allegheny County. In 1983 the Turtle Creek Multipurpose Center evolved into Eastern Area Adult Services (EAAS) and was incorporated as a 501C3 (Nonprofit Organization). 41 years later EAAS is still operating in Turtle Creek with our administrative offices in Keystone Commons and the Turtle Creek Senior Center right down the road at 519 Penn Avenue, Turtle Creek, PA on the first floor of the Human Services Center Mon Valley building. EAAS is largely funded by programs offered through the Allegheny County Department of Human Services/Area Agency on Aging.

The Senior Center is open to anyone over the age of 60, with the hours of 9am – 3pm Monday thru Friday. Activities, lunch, and information/assistance services are just a few things you can find there daily. Activities include Chair Exercise, Yoga, Tai Chi, Silversneakers, Bingo, educational lectures, health speakers, trips around Pittsburgh, season parties, and much more.

The Senior Center is also a provider of Home Delivered Meals to over 230 participants weekly in 20 different communities in and around Turtle Creek. Last year, 53,697 meals were delivered. Volunteers are always needed to help reach those homebound seniors on a Monday, Wednesday, or Friday! EAAS is also proud to be one of 6 "Meals on Wheels of Greater Pittsburgh" Organizations working together to help provide the best services possible to our consumers!

Volunteers can also help in the senior center by serving lunch, teaching a class, or by bringing/sharing new ideas to the center.
